

I Moses Samuel finding myself in a calm state of mind and perfect in all my mental faculties undertake to make this my last Will and Testament I resign my Soul to its Almighty Creator and die in a firm belief of the Divine Unity and hope of the future resurrection I bequeath all my property as herein stated fifty nine pounds ten shillings now in the hands of my second son Walter Samuel and seventeen Lever movements now in the hands of my brother Louis Samuel and amounting in value to twenty Pounds and also whatever money I have in the hands of my Daughter late Hannah Samuel now M^{rs} Hannah Woodburn of Southport but to her all those I give and bequeath to my second son Walter Samuel because he has nobly provided me with board lodgings and clothes and for his filial affection kindness and constant attention to me all my Books I hereby direct to be sold by degrees and the money to be given to my Grandson Alfred Woodburn and he may pick such Books as he likes for himself I bequeath the two portraits of myself and lamented Wife to my eldest Son Henry Samuel and my china part of which is in the hands of my second Daughter to Hannah Woodburn as my eldest Daughter made this sixteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and fifty two years
