This Will was proved at London before the Right Worshipfull John Bettesworth Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully and constituted the thirteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven by the oath of and Mary Overton widow the executrix and Richard Overton the son of the deceased and Executors in the said Will named so whom an Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods and Chattells and Credits of the said deceased having first made a solemn and sincere Declaration or Affirmation by Commission duly to Administer. - &c?

I Richard O'Real Citizen and Pawtucket of London being Sincere and weak of Body but of sound Mind memory and understanding Praise be God for the same Do make this my last will and Testament in manner following first and principally I recommend my soul to God that gave it and my Body to the Earth from whence it came and as to all my Worldly Estate I give devise and bequeath the same as followeth that is to say I do order and direct that all my Debts and funeral Expences shall in the first place be paid and discharged by my Executors hereinafter named and after Payment thereof then I give and bequeath unto my Brother John O'Real the sum of Ten pounds for Mourning also I give to James Fisher Baker and my sister Mary his Wife Ten pounds each for Mourning also I give to John Compton Colbow Chandler and my sister Ann his Wife ten pounds each for Mourning also I will and direct that my said Executors shall pay and discharge the Cost and Charge of the funeral of my Dear Mother Mary O'Real when ever it shall please God to call her the same to be celebrated in such manner as is directed in a paper signed by me and left in the hands of Mr Henry Balthou one of my said Executors also I give and bequeath all my Plate to my Daughter Sarah O'Real and all my China Ware except what my loving wife Mary O'Real brought with her and was her own before Marriage and all my Linnen to my said Daughter Sarah O'Real to be kept or sold for her proper use at the discretion of my said Executors also I give to my said Daughter a Gold Watch and all the rings and other things sealed up with my seal in a Needle worked Baggy also I give

All my Household Goods and furniture (Except the ginnen above mentioned
And all my Wearing Apparell Shooes Spurs and Whip to my said Wife and
Daughter to be sold together with all my Books by my said Executors for
the most that can be gotten for the same and the money thereby arising
to be divided between my said Wife and Daughter share and share to
alife Also I give and bequeath my two houses in Cateaton Street unto
my said Wife and Daughter as Tenants in Common for and during
the remainder of the lease whereby I hold the same and for as
much as I have been at very great Charge in repairing and reu-
improving the house I now dwell in of which I have a lease for
thirty two years to come and the same may be let at an advanced
rent And I am not to pay any rent for the year one thousand
seven hundred and forty one I do therefore leave it to the discretion
of my said Executors either to take a fine on Assigning the said
lease or to let it at an advanced rent which they shall think in
most advantageous to my said Wife and Daughter to whom I
give the same and all profits arising thereby to be equally divided
between them and I do hereby nominate and appoint Mr^r John
Henry Balthou Citizen and Draper of London and Mr^r John
Gow Citizen and Apothicary of London Executors of this my
last will to each of whom I give ten pounds for mourning and
all the rest and residue of my personal Estate that is to say
ready money Goods and stuff in trade Debts standing out on
Bonds and Notes of hand or otherwise howsoever I give and
bequeath to my said Wife Mary O'Neal and my said Daughter
Sarah O'Neal to be equally divided between them share and
share alife and as to my funeral I desire it may be in the
manner set forth in a paper signed by me and left in the hands
of the said Mr^r Henry Balthou one of my Executors And I do
hereby revoke and make void all former and other wills by me
heretofore made and declare this only to be my last will and
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal the thirtieth day of November in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven and I
hereby appoint and desire my said Executors to take care of my
said Daughter during her minority and I leave it to their
discretion to pay to her any of the money which shall come
according to this my will belong to her either at her age of
twenty one years or sooner if they should think fit so far as is

shillings a yard with several Shamingy Gloves and Crape Handkerchiefs
and no body to be invited but her own Relations and to be
performed in a decent manner according to the Order of my

annexed) before the Worshipfull Edward Dimastou Doctor of
Laws Surrogate of the Right Worshipfull John Abbotsworth Sr
of Laws Master Receiver or Commissary of the prerogative Court
of Cantebury lawfully constituted the twenty ninth day of December
in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty
seven by the Oaths of Henry Walther and John Couss the
Executors in the said Will named & whom Administration was
granted of all and singular the Goods Chattells and Credits of
the said deceased being first sworn duly to administer &c
