Obituary in the Times Apr. 15th 1889 reads. We have to record the death of General Sir John Fowler Bradford, KCB, which happened on Thursday last at his residence in Norfolk Square, Hyde Park. He was in his 85th year, having been born in 1805. he was the son of the late Captain Edward Chapman Bradford, an Elder Brother of the Trinity House, and entered the military service of the East India Company in 1821, and rising by steps of promotion obtained field rank in 1858. He saw active service with the 1st Bengal cavalry in Afghanistan in 1842 and in various actions leading to our reoccupation of Cabul* and took part in the Gwalior campaign of 1843-44. He commanded the above mentioned regiment in the Sutlej campaign of 1846 and also in the Punjab campaigns of 1848-49, for which he received the medal and clasps. He was made a Companion of the Bath in 1849 and was promoted to a Knight Commandership of the same Order in 1871. Sir John Bradford married in 1824 Eliza Martha, daughter of the late Sir William Ouseley, and was left a widower several years ago.

served John Company may be counted upon the fingers. On Friday last the grave closed over Major
General Evelyn Bradford, who first saw service in the old 14th Native Bengal Infantry about the time
when Pollock, "the avenger" was retrieving the Elphinstone fiasco. He served at one time as aide-de-
camp to Lord Harding and saw fighting on the North-West frontier in the first Sikh War; he had a look
in at Goojerant in the second and had two years of campaigning in the Mutiny. On transference to the
service of the Crown, like the rest of his conf. res of John Company, he completed his time in India and
retired in 1885. He was born 1823; father was Lieutenant Edward Bradford EIC. Elder brother of the
Lieut-General Sir John Bradford KCB. Subsequently commanded the Murset Division during and after
the Mutiny. The Bradford family for three generations were closely connected with Empire building in
India during the last century. (Source of obituary unknown also quite a few discrepancies. I was given
this document to start my research by Ernest Bradford, Evelyn's grandson by Ernest Evelyn and his
second wife Annie). Evelyn was buried in Highgate Cemetery grave No. 32816 square 143 Eastern
Cemetery 24th Jan. 1908. also buried in that grave is a Nora Lillian Bradford on 9th May 1895. The last
registered owner to the right of burial was George Octavius Man husband of Mary, 6th
Oct. 1909. Evelyn's will was proved in the principal Registry of Probate Division of his Majesty's High
Court of Justice on 3rd. 1908 by George Octavius Man of 39, Calcott Rd. Kilburn London. Executor. G

1841 Walter Bradford Woodgate b 20th.Sept. eldest son of Canon Henry Arthur Woodgate and Maria (Bradford) a fellow of St. Johns College. Educated at Radley College before going up to Brasenose College Oxford in 1858. An accomplished oarsman and sculler he won the University Pairs three times the sculls twice and twice rowed for Oxford in the Boat Race, 1862(in bow seat and 1864 in fourth seat) winning both races. By entering the Diamonds(challenge sculls) in 1866 under a false name and for having his Brasenose coxswain jump overboard at the start of the Stewards(challenge cup) in 1868 to lighten his Brasenose four, Walter Woodgate caused the adoption of Henley Regatta rules to specifically prohibit such conduct.The unwanted cox narrowly escaped strangulation by the water lilies. Woodgate and his homemade steering device triumphed by 100 yards and were promptly disqualified. A special prize for four-oared crews without coxs was offered at the regatta in 1869 where it was won by the Oxford Radleian Club and when cox were dropped from the Stewards in 1873 he “won his moral victory”. IN 1863 he founded the Vincents Club(name of the landlord who rented the rooms) in reaction against the Union Society who at that time barred smoking and drinking. Members were vetted and membership restricted to one hundred. An immediate success it went straight to the top of the undergraduate social heap. Membership cost thirty shillings per term and included free beer,coffee and

tea, none of which were available at the Union .Smoking was also allowed as were dogs, to accommodate Jenny, Woodgates fox terrier a notorious shredder of trouser legs. A lifelong bachelor he was called to the bar in 1872 and practiced for forty years. He helped coach numerous Oxford crews and was president of Kingston Rowing Club, he provided rowing coverage in Vanity Fair and contributed to the Field as well as having several books on rowing publishe. He died on 1st. Nov.1920 at Southampton.

Educated Radley College he entered the 4t. Foot in April 1865, served in the Abyssinian War and the Anglo-Zulu War. During the second Boer War he commanded a large force sent to capture the strategic hill during a night assault on the 23rd.Jan 1901, and was killed the following morning after a shell splinter struck his head above the right eye. There is a memorial to him on the Spioenkop Battlefield.
