

# Lacrosse Team Of Women Due To Sail Aug. 24

## Date Set for U. S. Tourists' Start Awaits Approval of English Association

The women's touring lacrosse team will sail for England August 24 on the *Corinthia*, if the English association finds that date satisfactory, it was decided yesterday by the executive committee of the United States Women's Lacrosse Association, which held its second annual meeting at the Carroll Club. September 28 has been tentatively set for the date of return.

Miss May Fogg, of Winnetka, Ill., manager of the last United States touring field hockey team, has been invited to go as manager of this first lacrosse team to play abroad. Fifteen players are being asked to go, as many of the national team as can arrange time for the trip, and others chosen with good distribution from the various sections—so that the technique gained on the trip can be put to wide use.

This year's national tournament will be held May 17, 18 and 19, it was planned at yesterday's meeting, and the place will probably be Philadelphia. The nominating committee, whose selections for next year's national officers will be voted on at the time of the tournament, is composed of Miss Gertrude Hooper, of Boston; Miss Amanda Norris, of Baltimore; Miss Barbara Black, of New York, and Mrs. Joyce Cran Barry, of Boston, president of the national association, *ex officio*.

Since a main objective of the trip is to gather as much as possible of English polish, in matches, observation and coached practice, the personal gain of the players will be added to by the taking of technical films, for which money was appropriated at the meeting.

Money was also appropriated for the sending of coaches to localities in this country in which there is rising interest in lacrosse but no local association as yet, such as Washington, where an association is expected to be formed in the coming season.

Attending the meeting were Mrs. Barry, Miss Helena Wheeler, of Westchester, and Miss Anne Pugh, of Baltimore, both national vice-presidents; Miss Katherine McLane, of Garden City, L. I., treasurer; Miss Lucille Burnham, of Boston, secretary; Miss Katherine Wetherill, president of the Philadelphia Association; Miss Gretchen Schuyler, president of Westchester; Mrs. James Quigley, of New York; Miss Martha Butler, vice-president, of New York, and Miss G. Willett, president, of Baltimore.
