At the McCord Museum in Montreal, Canada, there are quite a few pictures of May and Wolff family members. Each picture below has an embedded link that goes to the McCord Museum web site where each photo can also be viewed.

Thomas May married Ida Wolff. Ida had a number of siblings including: Richard, George Moritz Otto (known as Otto) and Alice Wolff. Thomas May had a half-brother Frederick who married Ida Wolff's sister Clara Mathilda Wolff. The photographs below were all taken by William Notman a Scottish emigrant to Canada who had a very successful career photographing Montreal society in the middle of the nineteenth century. The location of all these photographs is Montreal. There are two "Richard Wolffs" - the one photographed 1861-63 is plain "Richard Wolff" the one in 1882 is "Richard *de* Wolff" but I reckon they are the <u>same</u> person.


