Cabinets containing Forty models on paper of columns of different nations
to the Committee of the Academy of Fine Arts White Ladies Road Clifton in
Bristol and I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer of the said Academy
for the said Cabinets and their contents shall be a sufficient discharge to
my Executors I bequeath to my niece Emily wife of General Thomas

Greenaway of Guildford in the County of Surrey the following articles namely four portraits in indian ink by Branwhite a silver tea pot a silver sugar basin and pair of silver sugar tongs to match a silver cream jug all my ~~own~~ oriental china and also my books prints miniatures on ivory. To my cousin William Jones of Elm Green Cirencester Gloucestershire Esquire a painting in oil by my late brother George To my cousin Denison Jones a library chair and to my cousins The Misses Price Jones and Mary Jones a drawing of a Spanish Garden and the Lake of Nemi and two glass cases containing models in paper of a Chinese lady and child and Chinese porter To my great niece Lavinia Bröckelmann an enamel of Virgin and child To my friend Geraldine Hannah Pugh my plated tea pot wardrobe wearing apparel sofa pillows and personal ornaments. To my friend Catherine Lyndon my work table Photograph of the Crucifixion and chest of drawers To my great niece Emily Caroline Jauncey of Guildford aforesaid my watch chain and seals To my friend Mrs Broden a candle lamp To Mrs Hobbs (with whom I now reside if I shall be living with her at the time of my decease) my sofa, curtains, leather chair, wash stand, dressing table, commode and table cover. I bequeath the china jars on the chimney piece of my sitting room to Mr Alexander Allen of Rutland House White Ladies Road Clifton aforesaid Gentleman. I direct the remainder of my plate and furniture linen china and all other articles of house-keeping shall fall into and form part of my residuary personal estate. I bequeath the residue of my personal estate and effects of every kind and description unto the said Alexander Allen and the said Thomas Greenaway Upon trust to convert the same into money and thereout to pay my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses and divide the remainder into eight equal parts and pay one of such parts unto Elizabeth wife of my nephew Charles Thorne And I direct my said trustees to pay another of such parts unto Fanny the widow of my late nephew Henry Thorne if she shall continue his widow at the time of my decease and if she shall remarry during my lifetime then her part of my said residuary estate shall go to the child or children of my said late nephew Henry Thorne in equal shares and to pay another of such parts unto my niece Jane Sully wife of Frances Freeling Sully of Glendower Fernbank Road Redland Bristol Gentleman. I declare that if my said nephew George Thorne shall die in my lifetime his share shall be paid to his Widow if Frances Louisa the wife of the said George Thorne shall remarry during my lifetime then her part of my residuary estate shall go to the child or children of my said nephew George Thorne in equal shares And I declare that such child or children shall take the share which their parent if living would have taken and if my said niece Jane Sully shall die in my lifetime her share shall be divided between my other seven residuary legatees and the persons who will in case of their respective deceases become entitled thereto and to pay another of such parts unto my said niece Emily Greenaway but if she shall die in my lifetime then I bequeath her One eighth of my residuary personal estate unto and equally between her daughters Constance Greenaway and Ada Rundall Greenaway and if either of my said great nieces shall be then dead then I bequeath the said one eighth to the survivor of them And I declare that if either of them the said Constance Greenaway and Ada Rundall Greenaway shall be a Minor at the time of my decease it shall be lawful for my Executor to pay her or their share of my residuary personal estate unto her or their father whose receipt therefor shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors. And to pay another of such parts unto my great niece Augusta Bröckelmann of Heidelberg Germany and to pay another of such

parts unto my great niece Lavinia Bröckelmann of Heidelberg aforesaid and to pay the remaining one eighth part unto my great niece Ellen Caroline ~~uu~~ Bröckelmann of Heidelberg aforesaid I declare that if either of my said great nieces Augusta Bröckelmann Lavinia Bröckelmann and Ellen Caroline ~~uu~~ Bröckelmann shall die in my lifetime her or their share or shares shall go to the survivors or survivor of them I appoint the said Alexander Allen and Thomas Greenaway Executors of this my Will and I hereby revoke all other Wills by me at any time heretofore made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this eighth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty four — E. M. Cumberland — Signed by the said testatrix Eliza Martha Cumberland as and for her last will and testament in the presence of us present at the same time who at her request in her presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses — John G.
